- Lower the average age of the group;
- Outsourcing the administration frees up the HR staff;
- Moves groups to a fully-insured environment;
- Can lower the overall cost to the group and/or retiree;
- Groups can maximize their Rx subsidies with our EGWP/Part D program.
- Plans coordinate directly with Medicare and adjust annually automatically:
- Groups are not experts in Medicare and would like an advocate/specialist to help them;
- Groups desire plans that match or exceed current active plan design;
- Groups would like to have their experience pooled;
- Group can offer plans without any cost to them;
- Groups can use the plans as a recruiting tool.
